- 14:30 Drive to the Olympic Stadiums for a photo-stop view outside the building (entrance fee excluded)
- 16:00 Drive back to the hotel

Lama Temple



Lama Temple, also known as the Lamasery, lies on the eastern side of Lama Temple Street. It is a renowned lama temple of the Yellow Hat Sect of Lamaism, which is located in the northeast part of city. The Lama Temple is the largest, the most well-protected and typical lamasery in Beijing.

Jingshan Park



Situated in the center of Beijing, Jingshan Park is a beautiful royal landscape garden. Covering an area of 57 acres (about 230,000 square meters), the park stands on the central point of the south-north axis of the city and faces the north gate of the Forbidden City.

Hutong Tour



People say that the real culture of Beijing lies in the culture of Hutong and Siheyuan (courtyards). How true it is! They give an insight to the old lifestyle of ordinary Beijingers and have special appeal to tourists. As one of the most representative icons in local culture, Hutong Beijing is usually included in a classical tour itinerary there.

Olympic stadiums



The Beijing National Stadium, also known as the "Bird's Nest", is located at the southern part of the Olympic Green in Beijing, in the northeast of the city. As the main stadium for the 29th Olympiad in 2008, the National Stadium covers an area of 258,000 square meters (64 acres) and accommodates a maximum of 91,000 spectators with a permanent capacity of 80,000.

The National Aquatics Center, known as "The Water Cube" is one of the three landmark buildings of the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games. It is located inside Beijing Olympic Park, covering a total floor space of 50,000 square meters (12 acres). Ground was broken on December 24, 2003, and the Center was completed and opened for use on January 28, 2008.
